





Have You Heard of the Four Spiritual Laws?



Bible Lacking Sinner's Prayer Returned For Full Refund

WILSON, NC—After purchasing a defective Bible that seemed to omit the sinner's prayer—apparently due to some kind of printing error—local woman Gayle Dunsby reportedly returned the incomplete book to her local LifeWay Christian Store for a full refund Tuesday.

"It was really strange," Dunsby told reporters gathered outside the Christian bookstore after she had received back her \$36.99 plus tax in full. "I searched that Bible through and through and couldn't find anything about a magic prayer I could lead people to say in order to instantly get them into the Kingdom and have them be forevermore secure in their eternal salvation no matter what their life looks like afterward."

A LifeWay representative confirmed that the misprint may be part of a widespread issue after store associates were unable to locate a suitable replacement Bible for Dunsby, as none of the Bibles on their shelves seemed to contain the biblical sinner's prayer either.

"We're facing what is possibly an unprecedented, industry-wide misprint of the Word of God," the representative said in a brief statement to the press. "As we work diligently to locate the source of this error, let us be comforted by the words of Scripture: 'This too shall pass."

Woman Dies Of Awkward Feeling While Sharing Her Faith

COLUMBIA, SC—Local woman Michelle Desmond tragically dropped dead of a sudden, acute feeling of awkwardness Wednesday evening while sharing the gospel with one of her coworkers, a representative for persecuted church ministry Open Doors confirmed

Desmond was seen asking her associate from the accounting department whether or not he believed in God as the two exited the building for the night when the awkwardness attack occurred, leaving the 29-year-old Customer Service Representative crumpled on the floor as the coworker ran to get help.

The tragedy confirms many American Christians' worst fears, that the sense of discomfort which usually arises when telling an acquaintance about Jesus could potentially be fatal.

"This just goes to show you how dangerous it is to share the gospel in closed countries like America," the Open Doors representative said. "You really have to count the cost before you decide to open your mouth and proclaim His truth in your middle-class, suburban neighborhood—you could lose everything."

"Are you prepared to suffer a potentially deadly, super-awkward feeling for the sake of Jesus?" he added.

BATON ROUGE, LA—Many Christian leaders pridefully refuse to publicly repent, so it's always refreshing to hear of a pastor who is willing to admit when he is in the wrong.
