The Sovereignty of God

Does it mean:

- He orders and directs everything in the Universe?
- Nothing can interfere or obstruct His will?

How much has sin corrupted our human nature?

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TOTALLY Because of the Fall, we are totally depraved and dead in our sin. We are unable to save ourselves and, therefore, God must initiate salvation.

TOTALLY Because of the Fall, we have inherited a corrupted, depraved nature. "Prevenient" (preceding) grace has removed the guilt and condemnation of Adam's sin.

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Our Human Sin Condition

Does it mean:

- We are born guilty of sin because of Adam? [imputed]
- We are born with a predisposition to sin? [inherited]



Red or Green or Inbetween?

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CONDITIONALLY Election is based on God's foreknowledge of those who would believe in him through faith. God elected those who would choose him of their own free will. Conditional election is based on our future response.

For whom did Christ die?

Red or Green or Inbetween?

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ALL Christ died for everyone. The Savior's atoning death provided the means of salvation for the entire human race. Christ's atonement, however, is effective only for those of us (the elect) who believe.

Red or Green or Inbetween?

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YES Through the preparatory (prevenient) grace given to all by the Holy Spirit, we are able to cooperate with God and respond in faith to salvation. Through prevenient grace, God removed the effects of Adam's sin. Because of "free will" we are also able to resist God's grace.

Red or Green or Inbetween?

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NO By the exercise of free will, we can turn away or fall away from grace and lose our salvation.

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Bottom Line: Who is responsible for salvation?

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GOD ONLY Salvation is accomplished by the almighty power of the Triune God. The Father chose a people, the Son died for them, the Holy Spirit makes Christ's death effective by bringing the elect to faith and repentance, thereby causing them to willingly obey the gospel. The entire process (election, redemption, regeneration) is the work of God and is by grace alone. Thus God, not us, determines who will be the recipients of the gift of salvation.

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GOD & US Salvation is accomplished through the combined efforts of God (who takes the initiative) and us (who must respond) - our response being the determining factor. God has provided salvation for everyone, but His provision becomes effective only for those who, of their own free will, "choose" to cooperate with Him and accept His offer of grace. At the crucial point, our will plays a decisive role; thus we, not God, determines who will be recipients of the gift of salvation.

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Analogy: Drowning Victims

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All people are floating in the water dead in their natural condition (total depravity). They are born dead because that has been the condition of humanity since the first man and woman jumped into the water and died (original sin). There must be intervention if they are to be saved.



Red or Green or Inbetween?

RED While God calls out to all of them (general call), due to his mysterious choice, he brings back to life (regeneration) only certain people (election) while passing by the rest (reprobation). He does not use a life preserver, but grabs a hold of the elect individually and immediately pulls them onto the boat (monergism). They naturally grab a hold of God as a consequence of their regeneration (irresistible grace; sola fide). They forever stay on the boat due to their perpetual ability to recognize God's beauty (perseverance of the saints).

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GREEN God uses his power to bring every one of them back to life (prevenient grace), but they are still in the water and in danger of drowning. With the regenerated ability to respond to God, now God throws the life preserver to them and calls on them all to grab hold of it. They then make the free-will decision on their own to grab a hold of the life preserver (faith) or to swim away. If they grab a hold, they must continue to hold as God pulls them in (synergism). They don't need to do anything but hold on. Any effort to swim and aid God is superfluous (sola fide). They can let go of the preserver at any time and, as a consequence, lose their salvation.

RED = Calvinism

- Based on the theological beliefs and teaching of John Calvin (1509-1564), a leader in the Reformation
- Augustine originated the ideas

GREEN = Arminianism (Wesleyanism?)

- Based on the views of Dutch theologian Jacobus Arminius (1560-1609)
- Was in reaction to the growth of Calvinism

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Hyper-Calvinistic: The belief that it is not the duty of every unregenerate person without exception to repent and believe the gospel. Thus, according to this scheme, those who preach and witness are not to tell unregenerate people that God commands them to repent and believe the gospel.

- *No one can believe unless they are first regenerate*
- *God cannot require from us what we are unable to do*
- *Therefore God does not require the unregenerate to believe*
- *Therefore we should not tell people who might be unregenerate to believe*

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Pelagianism: The belief that humanity are basically good and morally unaffected by the Fall. It views us as fundamentally good and in possession of libertarian free will. With regards to salvation, it teaches that we have the ability in and of ourselves (apart from divine aid) to obey God and earn eternal salvation.

- *God cannot require from us what we are unable to do*
- *God requires that we should be perfect*
- *Therefore we must be able to be perfect*

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Open Theism: The belief that that God has granted to humanity free will and that in order for the free will to be truly free, the future free-will choices of individuals cannot be known ahead of time by God.

- *God's greatest attribute is love*
- *Man's free will is truly free*
- *God does not know the future*
- *God takes risks/learns/makes mistakes/changes his mind*

Red or Green or Inbetween?

Process Theism: The belief that God is engaged in the time sequence. He doesn't know the future. He has ideals for the future, and he tries to lure us to actualize those ideals, but he does not control each individual or occasion on the atomic scale. God needs us because without us he's not concrete. He sets the ideals, but then we create the content and God expands his actuality through us. We add to him.

Molinism: Named after 16th Century Jesuit theologian *Luis de Molina*, is a religious doctrine which attempts to reconcile the providence of God with human free will. *William Lane Craig* and *Alvin Plantinga* are some of its best known advocates today

The Sovereignty of God

- **Meticulous sovereignty:** God is the instrumental cause behind every action and reaction there has ever been.
- **Providential sovereignty:** While God is bringing about his will in everything, his will is not the instrumental cause of all that happens.
- **Providential oversight:** Here God's sovereignty is more of an oversight. He has a general plan, but is not married to the details.
- **Influential oversight:** Here God's sovereignty is self-limited.

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
